



These Gifts are Planned or Deferred Giving:

IRA or Pension Plan: Simply naming camp as a full or percentage beneficiary of a retirement account may provide significant tax advantages to the donor and heir.

Bequest: A gift made in a will or living trust may reduce the donor's taxable estate.




