Goals of the Grant

1. Physical improvements to benefit day campers

2. Primarily serve the Day Camp during the summer

3. Inspire new or greater Jewish philanthropy





Open to all qualifying Jewish Day Camps in the US

Up to \$20,000, matching \$1 for every \$2 you raise

Eligibility: Size of Camp

- 1. Camp must operate a minimum of 5 days/week for 4-weeks during the summer.
- 2. Minimum of 50 campers participating in each camp session.
- 3. In operation for 3 + years.





How to Apply



Application opens: on February 19

Deadline to apply: March 15

Decisions will be made: early April

What makes a strong application?

Aligns with 3 goals of the Grant

- 1. Jewish Mission
- 2. Projects that benefit Jewish campers and staff
- 3. Inspires greater philanthropy for your Day Camp
- 4. Engaged with ACA, FJC and/or JCamp 180



Jewish Mission

- Jewish ideals and values in mission statement
- Jewish practices at camp, such as-

Observance of Shabbat,

Israel programming,

Jewish education,

Hebrew at camp,

Living their Jewish values or other such practices





Supporting physical improvements at the day camp

Examples of physical improvements the Day Camp Grant would support

• Playgrounds	Indoor furniture
 Hand washing stations (permanent) 	Bundled purchases of multiple non-capital
New ballfields	items
Stand-alone moveable equipment (boats, picnic)	Landscaping and outdoor lighting
tables, farming equipment, bicycles, exercise	
equipment, sports equipment, playgrounds)	

Engagement with ACA, FJC, JCamp 180

Stronger if:

- Accreditation by the American Camp Association
- Network member of Foundation for Jewish Camp
- Affiliation with JCamp 180



Advancing Day Camp Philanthropy

Not required by preferred:

- Matching grant used to leverage more support for Day Camp
- Strategy for how you intend to use the match to inspire support
